

OTTAWA CHILDREN'S FESTIVAL DE LA JEUNESSE ACCESSIBILITY POLICY

PURPOSE:

The Ottawa Children's Festival de la jeunesse (OCF) is committed to diversity, inclusion and accessibility for persons with disabilities.

SCOPE:

This policy describes how the OCF works with its employees as well as how it provides its programs, goods and services in a manner that respects the dignity, independence, integration and equal opportunity of persons with disabilities.

POLICY STATEMENTS:

Assistive devices

The OCF permits persons with disabilities to use their personal assistive devices while visiting any of the Festival locations: LeBreton Flats Park and the Canadian War Museum.

Communication

The OCF is committed to communicating with persons with disabilities in ways that take into account their disability.

Service animals and support persons

The OCF welcomes, onto its Festival locations, service animals and support persons upon whom persons with disabilities rely. Visitors with special needs can receive a complimentary companion ticket.

Notice of temporary disruption

The OCF will notify persons with disabilities in the event of a planned or unexpected disruption to services or facilities. This notice will be provided via our website and in-person contact at the affected Festival site(s).

Training of employees

The OCF has a mandatory accessibility training policy for staff and volunteers regarding the provisions and ways to ensure accessible services. Training will occur on an ongoing basis and whenever changes are made to relevant policies, practices and procedures.
